## Rakatak

The **Rakatak** is a <u>percussion instrument</u> that originates from <u>Ghana</u>. The rakatak is made of several <u>calabash</u> gourd shells attached to a long, narrow wooden shaft joined to the longer main wooden handle at a 90-degree angle. Rakataks are often used in traditional African or neo-pagan music.<sup>[1]</sup>
